DEAL – ST. ANDREW



The Church of St. Andrew at Deal is by English standards modern although it is built in the Basilica style of Caen stone from the Allemagne Quarries, Portland stone for the Sanctuary and York stone for the Nave. It also has Sedilia and Piscina. The foundation stone was laid on the 28 May 1849 and Consecrated on the 31 October 1850 by the then Archbishop of Canterbury John Bird Sumner.

In April 1852 the area around the church was declared to be an Ecclesiastical District. The boundaries were defined in the 'London Gazette' and after they were confirmed the area became the Parish of St. Andrew on the 12 December 1867.

The Register of Marriages is complete from 1852. The first entry dated 31 May
