STANDING ORDERS

For the Regulation of Proceedings and Business of the Elham Board of Guardians.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

- 1.—The order of business at every Meeting of the Board shall be as follows:—

The Minutes of the last Meeting shall be read and signed. The business shall then be taken as stated in the Agenda, but the Board may at any Meeting vary the order of business so as to give precedence to any business of special urgency.

NOTICES OF MOTION.

- 2.—Every Notice of Motion shall be in writing signed by the Member of the Board giving the notice, and must be handed to the Clerk seven clear days prior to the day for which it is given.
- 3.—If a motion, notice of which has been duly given, be not moved, either by the member who has given the notice, or by some other member on his behalf, when it comes on in due course it shall, unless postponed by leave of the Board, be considered as dropped, and shall not be moved without fresh notice.

STANDING ORDERS.—*Continued.*

4.—No motion to rescind any lawful resolution which has been passed within the preceding six months, nor any motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived within the preceding six months, shall be in order, unless seven days' notice shall have been given to the Board, and the notice shall bear, in addition to the name of the member who proposes the motion, the names of six other members, and when any such motion has been disposed of by the Board, it shall not be competent for any member to propose a similar motion within a further period of twelve months. Provided always that these regulations shall not extend to any resolution which immediately concerns the allowance of relief to any person, or the punishment of any pauper, or to any resolution which the Local Government Board may request the Guardians to consider or amend, or to any question of emergency.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

5.—Every motion or amendment shall be moved and seconded, and shall, if required by the Chairman, be reduced to writing.

STANDING ORDERS.—*Continued.*

6.—A member of the Board shall stand when speaking, and shall address the Chair.

7.—A member who speaks shall direct his speech strictly to the motion under discussion, or to a motion or amendment to be proposed by himself, or to a question of order.

8.—A member shall not address the Board more than once on any motion or amendment, but the mover of an original resolution may reply, and in his reply shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers, and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate. Provided always that a member may speak to a point of order, or in explanation of some material part of a speech made by him which he believes to have been misunderstood. After the reply the question shall be put without further debate.

9.—A motion or amendment once made and seconded shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board, such consent to be given or withheld without debate.

STANDING ORDERS.—*Continued.*

10.—Whenever an amendment upon an original motion has been moved and seconded no further amendment shall be moved until the first amendment shall have been disposed of.

11.—If an amendment be rejected, other amendments may be moved on the original motion. If an amendment be carried, the motion as amended shall take the place of the original motion and shall become the question upon which any further amendment may be moved.

12.—On the motion of the chairman the Board can, on a vote, at any time resolve itself into Committee and sit in private.

SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS.

13.—Any one or more of the Standing Orders in any case of urgency or upon motion made on a notice duly given, may be suspended at any Meeting so far as regards any business at such Meeting, provided that three-fourths of the members of the Board present and voting shall so decide.
