REFERENCE SECTION

The Regnal Years

In each issue, this section will be a means of ready reference for the kind of information one would like to have by heart but knows one never will.

The dates in most documents before the Commonwealth give, not the Calendar year, but the year of the current sovereign's reign, the regnal year. It is not difficult to translate a regnal year into a calendar year, but it is also not difficult to make a mistake in the process. The following is a ready reckoner by which it may be done without calculations.

Explanation

Under the name of each sovereign in the table is shown the day and month he came to the throne, or at

any rate on which he was considered to have come to the throne. His regnal years began on that day in the calendar years listed below it, and ended on the previous day in the following years. The result of this is that two days in the same regnal year may fall in different calendar years. Examples: (1) Christmas in the 4th year of Henry II is 25th December. 1157; and Michaelmas in the same regnal year is 29th September 1158. (2) 27th March 3rd Charles I is in 1627, and 26th March 3rd Charles I is in 1628. The day before 27th

On the suppression of Battle Abbey, Henry VIII
retained the Manor of Wyke, except the quit
rents arising from the Manor of Slip Mill, which
he granted to Sir John Baker of Sissinghurst
Vol II. p 478

Sir John Baret was succeeded by Sir Richard,
in 1567. a controversy arose between him &
Mr Edmund Roberts and other tenants of the demesne
belonging to the Manor, over tithes.

The case was heard 4 Nov 1567, and it was decided
the tenants should hold in fee all commons,
waste lands and all woods & trees, reserving to
the complainant as Lord of the Manor all rents
payable.

In the next reign 10 Nov 1569. Sir Henry Baret. Bart.
conveyed the Manor to Lord Hunsdon the then
owner of Wyke, and they have since been held
together.

In 1639. Lord Hunsdon sold the Manor,
Lands & Vicarial tithes of Wyke to Henrice.

2nd Earl of Winchelsea, who purchased it
for £18,000. to add to the Eastwell estate

(Note - The only rent rolls which I have been able
to discover, are of quite recent date from about
1800 - to 1854 - copies of which are held by
Major Eric Clarke for the Cranbrook demesne, but
I am not aware whether he has them for the
Hansburch demesne).

Cloth Trade in the Weald

Prior to the arrival of the Flemish settlers in
the early 14th century - cloth was only made in the
Weald for local domestic consumption -

The Flemish clothiers were chiefly noted for the
introduction of fulling by water power. Fulling
had previously been done by hand (or feet!)
and the use of water power to drive the fulling
mills (very much like the later ironwork mills
of which you have written) was a revolutionary
step in the history of the craft - The physical
features of the Weald were well suited for the
purpose of constructing these mills -

While Cranbrook was the first settlement the
trade very quickly spread to Hambrook & elsewhere,
and by the end of the 15th century was firmly established in
Hambrook. There is a document in the

parent chart dated 1507, which records the
"breeding of the demesne" in that year, and among
boundary points notes "The boundary of this town
of Hambrook passed the bays of John Threnew in the
streams" - The bay laid back the water for the fulling
mill - Merew, of course is a very old local name

Another boundary point is the dye house of
George Roberts. J.R. was an important clothier.
May 15-20 - A daughter married Walter
Bryant Bonenden, another. George Bonenden of
Millhouse, both well known clothier families.
The den of Sesely is also mentioned as having
a fulling mill. — in Sopers Lane.

Chittenden were another very prominent
family in the trade, probably originating in Haverhill
& spreading to Cranbrook rather later. The family
is now strongly established today in the U.S.A.
The iron working were held to be responsible for the
decay in the cloth trade & an act "For the
Maintenance of Cloathing within the Parishes of
Cranbrook & St. Martin of the Parishes" was
actually introduced into the houses, but not
proceeded with.

account record the purchase of a copy of the Act
price 4^s — as well as "a book to regulate the
Wool in woolen price 2/6"

Boston's were another family long
settled in Haverhill. (?? did they
own the fulling mill in Sopers Lane).

A later member of the family. Capt. John
Boston was an officer in the parliamentary
army who afterwards purchased the
house of Wm. Stroverden, clothier in
Millhouse (or Bosington) —

With the gradual decline of the
trade in the Wald, other types of cloth
came to be manufactured — The last
factory was for making woolsted. — It was
at Haverhill & was owned by a member of
the Winch family (now of Cranbrook). Economic
difficulties were too great, & the work ceased
to be carried on towards the end of the 18th
century. —

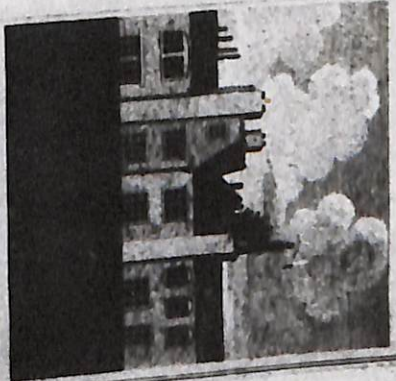

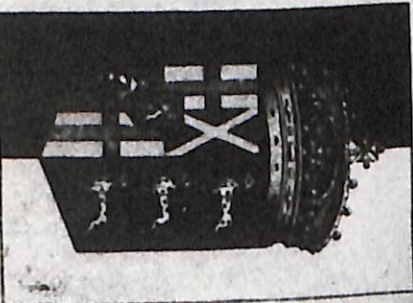
